

NOTICE OF TWO ADVISORY REFERENDA
Town of Crescent, Oneida County, Wisconsin
April 7, 2020, Spring and Presidential Preference Election

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at an election to be held in the Town of Crescent, Oneida County, Wisconsin on Tuesday, April 7, 2020, the following questions will be submitted to a vote of the people:

QUESTION 1: Shall the Town of Crescent adopt the following resolution?

Resolved that 'We the People' of the Town of Crescent, Wisconsin, insist upon the creation of a nonpartisan procedure for the preparation of legislative and congressional redistricting plans, and,

Further resolved that the process promotes more accountability and transparency and prohibits the consideration of voting patterns, party information, and incumbents' residence information or demographic information in drawing the maps, except as necessary to ensure minority participation as required by the U.S. Constitution.

EXPLANATION OF QUESTION #1: This is an advisory referendum

A "Yes" vote indicates you support creation of a nonpartisan redistricting process.

A "No" vote indicates opposition to creating such a process.

QUESTION 2: Shall the Town of Crescent adopt the following resolution?

Resolved that 'We the People' of the Town of Crescent, Wisconsin, seek to reclaim democracy from the expansion of corporate personhood rights and the corrupting influence of unlimited political contributions and spending. We stand with communities across the country to support passage of an amendment to the United States Constitution stating:

1. Only Human Beings are endowed with constitutional rights – not corporations, unions, non-profits or other artificial entities, and
2. Money is not speech, and therefore limiting political contributions and spending is not equivalent to limiting speech.

EXPLANATION OF QUESTION #2: This is an advisory referendum

A "Yes" vote supports amending the United States Constitution to make clear that corporations, unions, and other artificial entities do not have inalienable human rights, and supports limiting spending by corporations, unions and other artificial entities related to elections.

A "No" vote supports the position that corporations, unions, and other artificial entities have inalienable human rights, and supports unlimited spending by corporations, unions, or other artificial entities in elections.

A copy of the entire text of the resolution directing the submission of the question can be obtained from the office of the town clerk.

Acceptable Photo ID will be required to vote at this election. If you do not have a photo ID you may obtain a free ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.
